Minutes- Regular Board Meeting June 27, 2016 - A motion was made by Trustee Wolff and seconded by Trustee Rihn to approve the Regular Board meeting minutes from June 27, 2016. Voting For: Trustees Burcham, Rihn, Schieber, Wolff, Davis and Halpin Voting Against: none. Motion carried.

Operator's Licenses – July 11, 2016 to June 30, 2017 – Sophia Amick and Tucker Hovde, Kyle's Market - A motion was made by Trustee Davis and seconded by Trustee Wolff to approve both Sophia Amick and Tucker Hovde for an operator's license listed for the 2016 – 2017 period. Voting For: Trustees Davis, Wolff, Schieber, Rihn, Burcham and Halpin. Voting Against: none. Motion carried.

**Communications - Village President – President Gunnufson was excused.** 

**TIF Review of Debt capacity- Ehlers Report -** The review showed that Ehlers believes that by amending the TIF's, the 7 year term would be the best financing option.

**TIF amendment to share funds between TIF 3 & 4** – A motion was made by Trustee Schieber and seconded by Trustee Wolff to approve moving forward with processing an amendment to TIF 3 & 4 to allow debt payments to be accomplished by sharing funds between the two TIF districts. Voting For: Trustees Burcham, Rihn, Schieber, Wolff, Davis and Halpin. Voting Against: none. Motion carried.

**Street Financing - Terms** – A motion was made by Trustee Schieber and seconded by Trustee Rihn to approve 7 year financing terms for the 2016 street improvements. Voting For: Trustees Davis, Wolff, Schieber, Rihn, Burcham and Halpin. Voting Against: none. Motion carried.

**Street Financing – Funding Agency –** A motion was made by Trustee Davis and seconded by Trustee Rihn to use Dairy State Bank with the lowest interest rate of 2.01% for the 7 year term financing. Voting For: Trustees Rihn, Schieber, Wolff, Davis and Halpin. Abstained: Trustee Burcham. Voting Against: none. Motion carried.

Authorization to request bids for the pulverizing and resurfacing Pine Street and Maple Street – A motion was made by Trustee Rihn and seconded by Trustee Davis to move forward with the bid process for the pulverizing and resurfacing of Pine Street and Maple Street. Voting For: Trustees Davis, Wolff, Schieber, Rihn, Burcham and Halpin. Voting Against: none. Motion carried.

Ordinance review — Sec. 10-1-29 Parking Limits and No Parking Areas — consider updating Ordinance to include Sec. 10-1-29 (d) — A motion was made by Trustee Davis and seconded by Trustee Rihn to approve adding Sec 10-1-29 (d) which is No Parking on the south side of 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Park Drive to Highway 40. 



#### **Municipality Contract**

#### Agreement

This agreement, made and entered into this 1st day of August 2016 by and between the Village of Colfax Municipal corporation hereinafter referred to as the "village/township", and the Dunn County Humane Society, Inc., a nonprofit corporation hereinafter referred to as "the society".

#### Witnesseth

Whereas, the village/township by its council deem it advisable and for their best interest to turn over and designate the Society the care, sheltering, and placement of dogs and cats surrendered to them by the village/township's designated animal control agent. The Society will be responsible for the management of the shelter and the enforcement of state and local animal laws.

Now, therefore, in consideration of these premises it is mutually agreed between the parties hereto as follows:

#### I. Responsibilities of the Dunn County Humane Society Inc.

The society is hereby designated, employed, assigned, authorized, delegated and empowered to impound all lost, stray or homeless dogs and cats coming into its control as a result of violations of the animal regulations, and to place or humanely dispose of such animals.

In the furtherance of these obligations, the Society shall:

#### First: Manage and Operate Animal Shelter

- 1. The Society will furnish animal shelter facilities located at 302 Brickyard Road in the City of Menomonie, Wisconsin.
- 2. The Society will maintain proper housing for dogs and cats which come into its custody. The Society will service and impound dogs and cats that are potentially adoptable. The Society will serve as a referral agency if possible, for animals not mentioned above.

- 3. The Society will maintain suitable office hours at the animal shelter for the purpose of transacting business in connection with the duties under this contract and for the purpose of receiving animals or for accepting applications for the redemption of impounded animals.
- 4. The Society shall appoint competent and qualified agents for the carrying out of the responsibilities under this contract who shall be responsible to the elected officers of the Society.
- 5. The Society shall provide proper food, water, shelter and other humane treatment for such animals while they are in the Society's possession and until adopted or otherwise humanely disposed of.
- 6. The Society will cooperate with the appropriated health department or officers by following procedures required by any ordinance concerning persons or animals bitten by an animal at the Society's shelter.
- 7. The Society will serve as a centralized animal "lost and found" facility for persons within Dunn County.
- 8. The Society shall retain all fees for animals reclaimed by their owners during impoundment and shall retain all fees for animals adopted by patrons. This includes, but is not limited to, all fees provided for in Chapter 174 Wisconsin Statutes.

#### **Second: Medical Attention**

1. The Society shall provide an animal with immediate veterinary medical attention if necessary. Each animals is vet checked as soon as possible, vaccinated, tested for common diseases, dewormed and spayed or neutered if age appropriate. If the animal's owner is able to be identified all expenses incurred for daily boarding and veterinary medical care shall be the responsibility of the pet owner.

#### Third: Rabies Quarantine

- 1. The Society will not accept animals requiring quarantine. All animals requiring quarantine shall be referred to an appropriate veterinary clinic.
- 2. The Society will cooperate with the Health Department by following procedures required by any ordinance concerning persons or animals bitten by an animals in the village/township.

#### Fourth: Collection of Fees; Record-keeping

- 1. The Society will collect all impoundment, boarding and adoption fees and shall keep proper financial records to account for same. The Society will permit the village/township, at all reasonable times, to inspect and audit such records and shall make such reports of monies available when requested in writing.
- 2. The Society shall keep full and accurate records of all animals taken into custody and impoundment, showing the date, place, reason, and manner whereby animals were brought into custody with a description of the animal and a record of its final disposition.

#### Fifth: Assume Responsibility for Owner and Agent's Acts

1. The Society shall at its own cost and expense, carry insurance for the benefit of and to protect itself against all claims, demands, causes of action or judgments, and from all expenses that may be incurred in investigating or resisting the same. The Society shall, at its own cost and expense, cause to be bonded, all it agents, who in the exercise of their duties, collect and have custody of public monies. The Society shall fully inform all persons using or being upon the said premises of the non-liability of the village/township for any act or neglect of the Society.

#### Sixth: contract Not Assignable

1. The Society shall not have the right, authority, or power to sell, mortgage, or assign this contract or the powers granted to it without the prior consent of the village/township.

#### II. Responsibilities of the Village/Township

In compliance with the terms conditions of this contract, the village/township shall:

#### First: Supply all Licenses

1. The village/township shall purchase and supply to the public all such pet licenses, certificates, numbered (metallic) tags, and receipt forms as shall be required by the state or county in carrying out of its responsibility under law.

#### Second: Animal Control and Rescue of Animals

1. The village/township is responsible for animal control training and services within their boundaries as specified in Chapter 174 Wisconsin Statues. The village/township shall be responsible for the search and rescue of any covered injured animal or any covered animal which is trapped or is otherwise unnaturally restrained. The village/township shall be responsible for transporting such animals to the Society's shelter in a humane manner.

2. Any seizure of animals in excess of quantity of 10 shall be construed as a large scale influx, and shall not be the sole responsibility of the shelter. The village/township will be required to assist in the care and placement of the animals.

#### Third: Issuance of Fines

1. The village/township is responsible for the issuance of fines within their jurisdiction and the collection thereof.

#### Fourth: Method of Payment - How Computed

- 1. The two-year contract payment shall be computed on a per capita rate based on the human population estimated in the municipality to be served. For purpose of this computation, the estimated population as reported by the Wisconsin Department of Administration as of January 2015.
- 2. The <del>two year</del> contract shall be computed at a rate of \$1.52 per capita for the first year (2015) and \$1.63 per capita for the second year (2016).
- 3. It is understood and agreed that the contract sum shall be paid annually or quarterly with payments due upon receipt of the Society's statement.

#### Estimated 2015 cost to village/township:

Contract rate of \$1.52 per capita of 1,126 (per 2014 preliminary estimates from The Wisconsin Department of Administration) = \$1,835.38, with adjustments being made after the Wisconsin Department of Administration's final estimate of census figures are available in October of 2014. The adjusted figures will be reflected on the January 2015 statement.

#### Estimated 2016 cost to village/township:

Contract rate of \$1.63 per capita of 1,126 (per 2015 final estimates from The Wisconsin Department of Administration) = \$1,835.38, with adjustment being made for months already passed. \$1,835.38 less Jan – July \$1,070.64 = \$764.74 payable upon receipt of invoice.

#### III. Contract Length

It is mutually understood and agreed by the parties hereto that this agreement shall continue in effect for the remainder of 2016. However, it is fully agreed that during the contract period, this contract may be terminated by either party upon 90 days written notice to the other of an intention to terminate this agreement or enter into a new agreement.

It is mutually understood and agreed to by the parties hereto that the village/township will defend this contract with all due and proper diligence should it be challenged by any action in law.

with the passing public or neighbors. Any animal running at large unlicensed and required by state law or Village Ordinance to be licensed shall be seized and impounded by a humane or law enforcement officer or animal warden.

(2) A dog or cat shall not be considered to be running at large if it is on a leash not to exceed ten (10) feet in length and under control of a person physically able to control it when the animal is off of the owner's premises.

(d) Animals Restricted on Public Grounds and Cemeteries. No dog or cat shall be permitted in any public playground, school grounds, public park, beach, or swimming area within the Village unless such dog or cat is on a leash and under control. Dogs and cats are prohibited from being in cemeteries. Every dog specially trained to lead blind persons shall be exempt from this Section.

(e) Owner's Liability for Damage Caused by Dogs; Penalties. The provisions of Sec. 174.02, Wis. Stats., relating to the owner's liability for damage caused by dogs together with the penalties therein set forth are hereby adopted and

incorporated herein by reference.

#### SEC. 7-1-7 IMPOUNDMENT OF ANIMALS.

(a) Animal Control Agency.

(1) The Village of Colfax may contract with or enter into an agreement with such person, persons, organization or corporation to provide for the operation of an animal shelter, impoundment of stray animals, confinement of certain animals, disposition of impoundment animals and for assisting in the administration of rabies vaccination programs.

The Village of Colfax does hereby delegate to any such animal control

agency the authority to act pursuant to the provisions of this Section.

Impounding of Animals. In addition to any penalty hereinafter provided for a violation of this Chapter, A law enforcement or animal control officer may impound any dog, cat or other animal which habitually pursues any vehicle upon any street, alley or highway of this Village, assaults or attacks any person, is at large within the Village, habitually barks, cries or howls, kills, wounds or worries any domestic animal or is infected with rabies. In order for an animal to be impounded, the impounding officer must see or hear the violation of this Section or have in his/her possession a signed statement of a complaining witness made under oath alleging the facts regarding the violation and containing an agreement to reimburse the Village for any damages it sustains for improper

or illegal seizure.

Claiming Animal; Disposal of Unclaimed Animals. After seizure of animals under this Section by a law enforcement or animal control officer, the animal shall be impounded. The officer shall notify the owner, personally or through the U.S. Mail, if such owner be known to the officer or can be ascertained with reasonable effort, but if such owner be unknown or unascertainable, the officer shall post written notice in three (3) public places in the Village, giving a description of the animal, stating where it is impounded and the conditions for its release, after the officer or warden has taken such animal into his/her possession. If within seven (7) days after such notice the owner does not claim such animal, the officer may dispose of the animal in a proper and humane manner; provided, if an animal before being impounded has bitten a person, the animal shall be retained in the Animal Shelter for ten (10) days for observation purposes. Within such times, the owner may reclaim the animal upon payment of impoundment fees, such fees to be established by resolution of the Village Board. No

animal shall be released from the pound without being properly licensed if so required by state law or Village Ordinance.

d) Sale of Impounded Animals. If the owner doesn't reclaim the animal within seven (7) days, the animal control officer may sell the animal to any willing

(e) Village Not Liable for Impounding Animals. The Village and/or its animal control agency shall not be liable for the death of any animal which has been impounded or disposed of pursuant to this Section.

#### SEC. 7-1-8 DUTY OF OWNER IN CASE OF DOG OR CAT BITE.

Every owner or person harboring or keeping a dog or cat who knows that such dog or cat has bitten any person shall immediately report such fact to the Village Police Department and shall keep such dog or cat confined for not less than ten (10) days or for such period of time as directed. The owner or keeper of any such dog or cat shall surrender the dog or cat to a law enforcement or humane officer upon demand for examination.

#### SEC. 7-1-9 PIT BULLS AND OTHER DANGEROUS ANIMALS.

(a) Keeping of Animals Prohibited. It shall be unlawful to keep, harbor, own or in any way possess within the corporate limits of the Village of Colfax:

(1) Any warm-blooded, carnivorous or omnivorous, wild or exotic animal including but not limited to non-human primates, raccoons, skunks, foxes and wild and exotic cats.

(2) Any animal having poisonous bites.

- (3) Any pit bull dog provided that pit bull dogs registered with the Village on the day this Section becomes effective may be kept within the Village subject to the standards and requirements set forth in Subsection (b) of this Section. "Pit bull dog" as that term is used in this Section is defined to mean:
  - a. The Staffordshire bull terrier breed of dog;b. The American pit bull terrier breed of dog;

c. The American Staffordshire terrier breed of dog;

d. Any dog which has the appearance and characteristics of being predominantly of the breeds of Staffordshire bull terrier, American pit bull terrier, American Staffordshire terrier, or a combination of any of these breeds.

(b) Keeping of Registered Pit Bulls. The provisions of Subsection (a) are not applicable to owners, keepers or harbors of pit bull dogs registered with the Village of Colfax keeping, owning or harboring of such dogs is however subject

to the following conditions:

(1) Leash and Muzzle. No person shall permit a registered pit bull dog to go outside its kennel or pen unless such dog is securely leashed with a leash no longer than four (4) feet in length. No person shall permit a pit bull dog to be kept on a chain, rope or other type of leash outside its kennel or pen unless a person is in physical control of the leash. Such dogs may not be leashed to inanimate objects such as trees, posts, buildings, etc. In addition, all pit bull dogs on a leash outside the animal's kennel or pen must be muzzled by a muzzling device sufficient to prevent such dog from biting persons or other animals.

#### **2016-2 ORDINANCE AMENDMENT – SEC. 10-1-29 (a)**

#### AN ORDINANCE REGARDING PARKING LIMITS AND NO PARKING AREAS.

The Village Board of the Village of Colfax, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 10-1-29 of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Colfax, Wisconsin, is hereby retracted and repealed as follows:

**Sec 10-1-29 (a) PARKING LIMITS.** When signs or parking meters are erected in any block giving notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle for longer than the period hereinafter specified at any time between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. except Sunday and holidays.

- (1) Two (2) hour parking limit on Main Street or State Truck Highway 40 between Third Avenue and University Ave.
- (2) Two (2) hour parking limit on the south side of River Street between Highway 40/Main Street and the alley to the east of property at 310 River Street.
- SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.

#### **Third Avenue Reconstruction Project**


The pre-construction meeting has been scheduled for Tuesday, July 26, 2016. Expected start date will be determined that day.

Note: Other mandatory employer-paid contributions for duty disability, the state's Accumulated Sick Leave Conversion Credit Program or unfunded liabilities are not included and vary by employer.

The 2017 rate increases are primarily due to higher life expectancies and lower-thanexpected trust fund investment performance. This is a part of the unique "shared risk" design of the WRS, which includes 1) employee contributions, 2) employer contributions and 3) investment earnings. Together these funds must be sufficient to meet the present and long-term retirement benefit commitments of the system. Investment income contributes approximately 75% of WRS funding requirements.

In general, when investment earnings are greater than expected, contribution rates may decrease the following year. When earnings are lower than expected, rates may increase to make up for the shortfall.


Changes in WRS contribution rates have been very stable over the years because investment returns for the Core Fund are smoothed over a five-year period. Smoothing works to control year-to-year volatility in the stock market.

#### Storm Update 15 – July 21, 2016 6:00 pm

Weather- Severe storms again rolled across Wisconsin today. Strong winds gusting up to 75 mph knocked down multiple trees and power lines. Xcel Energy estimates power will be restored to all its customers by Friday at 8 p.m. Four campers sustained minor injuries at the Birch Grove campground inside the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest in Bayfield County. The U.S. Forest Service has issued an area closure for the portion of the Washburn Ranger District north of Highway 2 due to downed trees and debris. National Forest roads, trails and developed recreation sites north of Highway 2 are also closed until further notice. Excessive Heat Warnings and Advisories continue for much of the state. Heat index values of 100 to 110 degrees are possible Friday. The Advisory includes many of the counties and tribes affected by flooding. Residents can also call 2-1-1 for heat-related health and safety information.

#### **County by County Update:**

**Ashland County-** The Red Cross is opening a shelter at the Good Shepherd Lutheran Church due to power outages in the area. The address is 311 13<sup>th</sup> Street West in Ashland.

**Iron County-** Crews have removed the last known submerged boat in Saxon Harbor. The search for missing boats and vehicles has been suspended.

**Red Cliff Band-** Due to power outages, the Red Cliff Tribe is opening a shelter at the Red Cliff Community Health Center located at 36745 Aiken Road in Bayfield. The Red Cross is supplying 30 cots and 60 blankets.

**Road Updates:** US Hwy 2 now open to all traffic in Ashland, Iron counties. Work continues to repair, reopen remaining highways. Also, U.S. Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx last night announced the availability of \$4.15 million in Emergency Relief (ER) funds from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to help repair roads and bridges damaged by heavy rains and subsequent flash flooding in northern Wisconsin.

#### **Ashland County**

WIS 13 corridor is closed between Mellen and WIS 112. Use WIS 77, US 51, US 2 as alternative route.

#### **Bayfield County**

US 63 is closed at Twentymile Creek near Grand View. Traffic is detoured via County Highway N and County Highway A. Work to repair damages on US 63 began Monday, July 18. The project will include debris removal, culvert repair and pavement work. WisDOT anticipates this project will be complete and US 63 will be open to traffic mid-August.

#### **Iron County**

WIS 122 closed north of US 2 to Michigan State line. Work expected to begin next week. No official detour posted.

WIS 169 is closed between WIS 13 and US 2. Use WIS 77, US 51, US 2 as alternative route. Work to replace the culvert at the South Tributary to Vaughn Creek, located one-half-mile north of Gurney (between Cameron Road and Jensen Road) began on July 19. Project completion is scheduled for August 31.

The State Emergency Operations Center remains elevated to Level 2 with Wisconsin Emergency Management, Wisconsin National Guard, Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Wisconsin State Patrol, Wisconsin Department of Administration, Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and Wisconsin Department of Health Services along with the American Red Cross. WEM Regional offices remain on scene working with county emergency management agencies.
